## **Zoom Classes Useful Information**



A confirmation with the Zoom login links will be emailed two days before the class starts. Please check to make sure you have it and know where to find it on the day before the class starts. If you don't have it, send an email to Karen Fenichel— <a href="mailto:Knollwood14@gmail.com">Knollwood14@gmail.com</a> or call (203) 747-9675.

Closed Caption feature for Zoom classes—After you join a Zoom meeting, look on the lower banner of your Zoom screen for the CC icon or tap on the MORE icon. To adjust the size of the text, tap on the "up" key next to CC icon. You can move the text box around on your screen, by clicking on it, and dragging it to where you want it to go.

Members of the same household who are sharing one device (computer, tablet or phone) only need to register and pay for one person.

If you've never used Zoom before or have a new device, please test your camera and microphone ahead of time. Click https://zoom.us/test to see if you have a working camera and microphone.

To login into the class with a computer or tablet, click on the link in the confirmation letter.

To login into the class with a phone, you may need to dial (646) 558-8656 and login by typing in the Meeting ID (Passcode from the confirmation letter) and Meeting passcode (Access Numbers from the confirmation letter.)

Late registrations for Zoom Classes. If you register for a Zoom class within two days of the start of class, you should contact the **Registrar at (203) 747-9675** for the class link. This does not prevent you from registering at a later date, but it will ensure that you will get the link to the Zoom class.

**Zoom Class Recording** —Many of our Members have asked if classes will be recorded so they can make up a missed session. We recorded some ILR Zoom classes this semester and have worked on the details of how this will work. More information will be included on the ILR website and the registration website soon. Members have the option when they register of not being included in the recording.

#### Why am I on a Waitlist?



There are so many wonderful instructors and topics each semester. ILR understands your disappointment.

Students are placed on a Waitlist when the registrants exceed the number of students which the SGL prefers in order to achieve his/her teaching objectives.

The venue has limits on the capacity of its rooms due to fire code restrictions.

Students enter the Waitlist in order of date and time of registration. They receive notification that they are on the Waitlist.

The Curriculum Committee may reach out to the SGL about their willingness to admit a few more students from the Waitlist. If the SGL is amenable, Waitlisted students are contacted in the order of their place in the queue about their admission.

It is not acceptable to arrive at class and expect admission by imploring the sympathy of the SGL. This is not fair to put the SGL on the spot nor fair to Waitlisted students who hold a higher place in the queue.

ILR does not offer the option of auditing classes.

ILR administration appreciates your adherence to these parameters to ensure smooth and conflict free learning experiences.

# ILR Reaching Out to New Haven area Community-at-Large.

Like many of ILR's students, the Institute for Learning in Retirement is trying something new: turning its attention outside

of its usual community to attract new members. This year, ILR formed a Communications Committee. The committee is reaching out to the community at large to tell ILR's story and attract new members. Its first steps have been successful. "As ILR approaches its 35th birthday, its leaders realized that without bringing in some new faces, the organization faces a tough road ahead. Members participating in the survey were



getting older and the pandemic had cost the organization many members," said Doug Fenichel, APR, who heads the committee. "Traditionally, people learned about ILR by word of mouth. Our committee has developed a plan that builds on that and introduces the organization to a new group of people." Fenichel said the committee is targeting organizations and gatherings where older adults congregate. Over the summer, members of the Communications Committee and ILR volunteers staffed booths at festivals and fairs in Hamden, North Haven, Milford, and New Haven. It participated in small venues, such as local concerts, and larger ones, including the Milford Oyster Festival and New Haven's Folk Fest. "People were intrigued," said Fenichel. "In some cases, we were reintroducing ourselves, but in most cases, we were talking to potential students who had never heard of us. And they were extremely interested. We also found a few potential SGLs." The committee turned over many names to the membership committee and spun off a group whose job was to call the people who had talked to members and requested more information. The Committee is about to begin visiting active-adult communities in the area to tell the ILR story there. It also plans to use the organization's 35th anniversary to garner some news coverage in local media.
